#### CIRCUIT COURT.

County Loses Road Case-Report of Grand Jury Submitted.

Gantenbein vs Oregon City Mfg Co; jury failed to agree after being out 24 hours and were discharged.

Oregon City vs Clackamas Co; petition of the city for a writ of review to compel the county court to pay over the \$5,400 road money collected by the county within the limits of Oregon City; order granted as prayed for and county court ordered to vacate the order previously made, and to audit and pay the claim of the city as presented. Upon notice of the county's intention to appeal the case, the court granted a stay of execution until the appeal can be perfected. Alliance Trust Co vs J H Woodward

et al; demurrer overruled.

The first indictment against Cass U. Barlow, charging him with embezzling \$2,000 from the Barlow-Will Mercantile Co was withdrawn and a new one, more carefully drawn but charging the same offense, was substituted. The defendant was arraigned Saturday afternoon, entered a plea of not guilty and the case was continued for the term. By request of both parties it will be the first case tried at the November term of court.

George Herren vs Wm Boston; settled by defendant paying \$100,each party to pay his own costs.

Grand jury submitted final report and was discharged Saturday afternoon.

T R Worthington vs Henry Theissen; motion for new trial denied; this suit involved the possession of 10 acres of land now incorporated in the farm of the defendant near Milwaukee. The first trial was an action for ejectment brought five years ago, resulting in favor of defendant. A new bearing was granted a year ago when the jury found for the plaintiff. 


