CIRCUIT COURT.

County Loses Road Case—Report of Grand Jury Submitted.

Gantenbein vs Oregon City Mfg Co; jury failed to agree after being out 24 hours and were discharged.

Oregon City vs Clackamas Co; petition of the city for a writ of review to compel the county court to pay over the \$5,400 road money collected by the county within the limits of Oregon City;

Alliance Trust Co vs J H Woodward et al; demurrer overruled.

The first indictment against Cass U. Barlow, charging him with embezzling \$2,000 from the Barlow-Will Mercantile Co was withdrawn and a new one, more carefully drawn but charging the same offense, was substituted.

Isaac Traynor vs Frederick Marshall; judgment for \$275.

George Herren vs Wm Boston; settled by defendant paying \$100, each party to pay his own costs.

Singer Sewing Machine Co vs Helen Thompson; judgment for \$60 and no costs.

C B Moore vs Clackamas Co; defendant given until today (Friday) to file answer.

Grand jury submitted final report and was discharged Saturday afternoon.

T R Worthington vs Henry Theissen; motion for new trial denied; this suit involved the possession of 10 acres of land now incorporated in the farm of the defendant near Milwaukie.

The decision of County Judge Hayes in the matter of the will of Matilda D. Holt was confirmed by Judge McBride Monday. Mrs. Holt died in this city December 28, 1892 at the age of 72 years.

We have investigated a large number of cases that have been brought before us in which we did not consider the evidence presented to us sufficient to sustain an indictment and upon which we have made no report, thereby consuming a great deal of our time.

We visited the different county offices and found the books and accounts neatly and well kept and as far as we could see each of said officers was accounting for all public money received by them. We visited the county and city jails and found them neat and well kept.

We do not consider it necessary at the present time to make any recommendations for the expenditure of county funds, and now, having finished our labors, we ask to be discharged.
