While turning the corner of Fourteenth and Main streets, and crossing the East Side Railway Company's track at that place, the hind wheel of his heavily loaded wagon was detached, causing the vehicle to lurch to one side and drop on the track. The wagon and its load stayed in this position until a passing good samaritan, in the shape of a man with a strong team of horses, hitched onto it and pulled it out of harms way into the road at the side of the track, where it lay until the owner could his himself to a blacksmith shop and have the needed repairs made. This incident is no more than might have been expected, as for the last two months this crossing has been in a condition to render traveling over it hazardous at all times, the gravel having worn away from the track on either side, leaving the rails projecting several inches above the level of the road. This makes a hard pull for loaded teams, and when the wheels of wagons and buggies strike the rails obliquely it is apt to result disastrously for the vehicle. Such a condition of things is both dangerous and unnecessary. The East Side Railway Company, when they put their line through the city, made a contract to keep the space between the rails and one foot on each side in repair.
