

COUNTY COURT.

Many and Various Petitions Considered—Bills Allowed

Proceedings of March 1898 term. Pres. G. B. Hayes, judge; and S. F. Marks and Frank Jaggar, commissioners.

In the matter of the report of viewers of damages on the road petitioned for, by Adolph Koser, et al. the same was granted and road ordered opened.

In the matter of the report of viewers of damages claimed on the change of New Era and Waldron road by Joseph Rief, the petitioner was allowed \$10 damages.

In the matter of the road petitioned for, by G. Wallace, et al, the petition was denied.

Permission was given supervisor Erb. of road district No. 35, to work the roads in his district, but the men must wait for their money until there is some road fund in the county treasury.

Application for survey on the Barlow and Silverton road was granted, and Deputy Surveyor Isom appointed surveyor to locate the same.

In the matter of the appointment of Justice of the Peace for Clackamas district No. 2, H. A. Webster was appointed to fill the vacancy.

Supervisor Erb. of road district No. 35, was granted an application to build a bridge in his district.

In the matter of burial lots for paupers it was ordered that warrants be issued in favor of Oregon City amounting \$75 in payment for same, whenever the proper certificates are filed.

In the matter of the claim of Oregon City vs Clackamas county for road money, it was ordered that George C. Brownell be employed to ask the supreme court for a re-hearing of said case and to receive no fees except the necessary expenses, if they do not win the suit.

In the matter of the claim of ex-county Treasurer against Clackamas county for \$28 00, the claim was allowed on order from the circuit court, and warrant ordered drawn on the treasurer for the same.

In the matter of planking the Highland road, it was ordered that the county furnish the material, provided the people do the necessary work.

In the matter of the care of D. H. Tuttle, a county charge, it was stated that an offer had been received to keep him for \$7 per month, and it was ordered that K. Taber be notified of the fact.

In the matter of graveling and grading one mile of road in district No 1, for about \$500, it was ordered that the county furnish one-half the expense, if the people interested will donate the other half.

In the matter of purchasing a new kind of powder, it was ordered that one ton be contracted for from McIntyre at 25 cents per pound.

In the matter of the claim of E. Barrett for \$30 damages caused by a horse breaking its leg on the public road near Reedland. The sum of \$25 was allowed.

In the matter of planking the Highland road, it was ordered that Beeson & Sons be awarded the contract for furnishing 30,000 feet of plank at \$5 per thousand delivered, or \$3.75 at the mill.

In the matter of the reinstatement of G. W. Bentley upon the indigent soldier list, who was removed by mistake, it was ordered that G. W. Bentley be reinstated from March 1, 1898.

In the matter of the purchase of the John Brenner place, it was ordered that the county sell the same to M. J. Gallagher.

In the matter of the change of keeper for Mrs. C. A. Fox's mother, a county charge, it was ordered that she be placed in the care of Mrs. Winesett, to commence March 11, 1898.

In the matter of the delinquent taxes on the Brenner place for the year 1895 and 1896, the sheriff was ordered to cancel the same.

In the matter of bid of Lindsay & Son for furnishing plank on the Molalla road, the same was continued until the April term.

In the matter of the petition for county aid for Miss Forrester, the same was denied.

In the matter of the resignation of P. T. Oatfield as clerk of election in Milwaukee precinct, the same was accepted, and John Oatfield appointed to fill such vacancy.

In the matter of the petition of the Florence Crittenden home for aid, the same was denied.

In the matter of increasing the allowance of Mrs. Grindstaff, an indigent person, the amount was ordered increased from \$4 to \$7 per month, the warrant was ordered drawn in favor of A. M. Shibley.

In the matter of the resignation of G. E. Linn, as constable for district No. 14, the same was accepted.

The corrected description of Cascade precinct, was accepted.

The petition of P. H. Marley for re-lease of illegal assessment was granted. The following claims against the county were ordered paid:
