CARRICO.—Mrs. Sarah Carrico died at the residence of her son, Thomas Carrico, Wednesday March 23, at the age of 68 years, 11 months and 21 days. She was born in Beaver County, Pa. For a time she lived in St. Louis. She crossed the plains in the year of the terrible Mountain Meadow massacre, in which John D. Lee, a bishop of the Mormon Church, murdered 150 peaceful emigrants. A peculiar providence led her party to separate from the caravan some time before, thus being saved from Mormon ferocity. In 1863 she came to Portland and was married to James Carrico, a 49 miner. Several years were spent at Silver City, Idaho. The family then returned and lived successively in Gevails, Kalama, St. Helens, Columbia City, Woods Landing and Oregon City.
