PATRIOTIC SERVICES.

Held in the Methodist Church Last Sunday Evening.

Patriotic services were held in the Methodist church in this city, of which Rev. Oberg is pastor, last Sunday night. The G. A. R., and W. R. C., were present in full force and the church was crowded. After the opening voluntary, the congregation joined in singing the opening hymn. This was followed by prayer by Rev. Oberg.

"Praise Ye The Lord" an anthem by the choir was followed by a scripture lesson appropriate to the occasion. Colonel Robert A. Miller then delivered an address commemorative of the occasion, and in an eloquent manner portrayed the loyalty of American citizens and their duty to the country. He was listened to with marked attention and his address was highly appreciated.

Mrs. Rev. Oberg then sang the "Star Spangled Banner," in a charming manner that almost produced a ripple of applause, the time and place alone preventing an outburst of enthusiasm.

Hon. Geo. C. Brownell delivered an appropriate address in which he eloquently portrayed the valor and patriotism of loyal Americans and closed with an eloquent peroration in patriotism and loyalty.

The entire congregation joined in singing "America" and were dismissed with the benediction by Rev. Oberg.

There are no more patriotic people in the world than the Methodist and their untiring devotion, many sacrifices and liberal donations in the dark days of the rebellion won for them a name that is one of the brightest stars in American history.

CIRCUIT COURT.

Transacts Business and Adjourns for the Term.

In the Circuit Court this week the divorce case of Ball vs. Ball was taken under advisement until June 9.

In the case of Stock vs. Putkamer, suit to recover on a mortgage, it was ordered that the property be sold, the mortgage given to Honeyman & McBride, satisfied, and the balance, if any, applied on the stock mortgage.

In the Probate Court Gustav A. Schnabel was discharged as administrator of the estate of Robert Schnabel.

James M. Tracy, sr., was discharged as administrator of the estate of A. T. Plowman. All the property at issue was willed to Truman McIntyre and wife.

The final report on the estate of John Anderson was made and the executor discharged.

Charles Clayson, administrator of the estate of W. H. Clayson, filed his report showing receipts amounting to \$5,000. The court ordered the claims paid, the balance on hand to be applied on the commission of the administrator. Tuesday, June 7, was set for the final hearing of the case. Court adjourned Wednesday for the term.
