Many Bills Read but Little Interest Out side of Senatorial Fight-Brownell's and Porter's Bills.

Senator Porter'bills to amend the code parovides that in all cases where service of summons is made by publication, the defendant shall appear immediately on the completion of the notice or judgment may be taken. It also authorizes the county judge to grant an order for serwice of summons in the absence of the circuit judge. This is to avoid tedious delays where terms of circuit court are infrequent and does not apply to cases where personal service is obtained.




