A Letter From John M. Moss.

The following letter was handed in for publication by S. W. Moss, well-known to all residents of Oregon City.

ASPEN, Colorado, June 10, 1885.

Dear Brother: I don't know whether this letter will ever reach you or not, and I hardly know where to direct it to, but will give you a trial any way.

I should like to know how all the folks are and what you are all doing. I suppose if they are all alive they are near home. I presume I am the only rambler in the family. I believe, as near as I can remember, it has been about 10 years since I left home, and I will say it is the first time that I have felt homesick or had the blues. Perhaps it is because I am in a dull town. I will not stay here if times do not pick up soon. This is my second trip in here. I wrote you from here about one year ago, but have never received an answer to it.

Walter, I want to know something about my share of the property (if I have any) and if I can sell it for anything? Please let me know for I will have to raise money before long. I am divorced from my wife now and nothing will prevent me from selling.

I may never go home, should I ever, my stay will be short for I cannot content myself in a quiet place. I have been in a rough and tumble country ever since I left home. I should like for you to let me know something of Alaska if you know anything about the country. I have heard several reports from there lately that are very favorable. If I should go there of course I will come home for a short time. It may be a little chilly up that way, but it can't be much colder there than it is warm in old Mexico.

I would like for you to find out what you can get for the property, whatever I own, or any part of it, and make out a power of attorney and send it to me and I will have it acknowledged and send it back if the price suits me, which I suppose it will.

I have not seen any one from Oregon since I left Boise City in '71, only Billy Paterson, that I think was in '75. Joe Schram was killed in Eureka, Nevada, I think about the same time. Since then I have always been among strangers of all nations and colors. I never have seen my wife since I left her in the spring of '77. I changed my name while playing and have always avoided meeting her. She at last gave up and got a divorce.

Please tell me all you can about home. Give my love to all who are living. Your brother, JOHN M. MOSS.

EXPERT TOBACCO TESTING.

Cuban Buyers and Their Highly Developed Sense of Smell.

The greater part - in fact, nearly all - of the tobacco raised in Cuba and not used by the Cuban cigar makers is shipped to the United States. At certain seasons of the year the Havana hotels are filled with tobacco buyers from the United States. Some of them deal through the brokers in Havana, but some who know the country and the language go out into the tobacco district and deal directly with the planters, often buying a promising crop before it is picked. The tobacco buyer has necessarily to be a good judge of tobacco. He goes down into the very center of the bale of tobacco he is examining, extracts some samples and tests them in different ways.

The first test is that of smell. The Cuban tobacco has a strong and peculiar odor. A little variation one way or the other makes the tobacco good or bad. After smelling it the buyer is likely to roll a rudely constructed cigar out of the leaf and smoke it. He will inhale the smoke and endeavor to determine exactly the flavor. He will also examine the ash carefully and test also the combustion of the tobacco - that is, try to find out how long it will hold fire. It is a great annoyance to a smoker who is talking or writing or otherwise engaged to put his cigar into his mouth and find that it has gone out. No cigar ever tastes so good after it has once gone out, and a fine Havana cigar is positively rank when it has met such a catastrophe. So one quality sought for is that of holding fire. If a sample smoked by the buyer will keep lighted four minutes, it is considered very good. Some will burn for five minutes and even longer without being puffed. - Ohio State Journal.
