Proceedings of the June Term of the County Board.

THURSDAY, June 1st, 1899.

WEDNESDAY, June 7th, 1899.

Remembered that at a regular meeting of the board of county commissioners for the county of Clackamas, Oregon, begun and held in the house in said county and state on Tuesday, the 7th day of June, 1899, same being the regular time fixed and held for holding a regular session of said board for the transaction of business. Present, Commissioners: F. Marks, J. R. Morton, R. Scott, J. Dixon, clerk; J. J. Cooke, auditor.

It is ordered that Supervisor Crossin be allowed \$30 for road work in district No. 10.

It is ordered that Supervisor Heia be allowed \$10 for road work in district No. 10.

It is ordered that, on request of Sheriff Heia, that the time for the collection of taxes be extended to July 1st, 1899.

It is ordered that County Surveyor S. W. Gray make a survey of the Gray's Mill Oregon City road and report same at the next regular meeting of the board.

On the matter of opening the Bonney road, it is ordered that Supervisor Matson open said road at a cost not to exceed \$75.

On request of Mr. Zuehl, it is ordered that Supervisor Smith use \$75 in bringing east end of Molalla and Canby roads.

It is ordered that board accept invitation to attend dedication exercises of the Gray's Mill.

On the matter of opening the Gray's Mill and Cutting road—Now comes Supervisor Bonney, of road district No. 21, reports that he had started to improve said road outside of the limits of district, and he now asks that Supervisor Engle, of district No. 22, in which the part of said road lies where he started to improve, and the board be fully advised, it is ordered that Supervisor Engle, of district No. 22, be ordered to finish the improvement of said road.

It is ordered that Supervisor Hutchins be allowed \$60 for road work in district No. 20.

On the matter of fencing up the Cochran and Killen road, the board being informed that Mr. Pope, who owns property along said road, intends to fence up said road, claiming it is not a legal road, the board being satisfied of the legality of said road, it is ordered that Supervisor Taylor, of road district No. 35, which said road is situated, be ordered to notify Mr. Pope not to fence said road.

It is ordered by the board that Supervisor Bonney be allowed \$90 for road work in road district No. 21.

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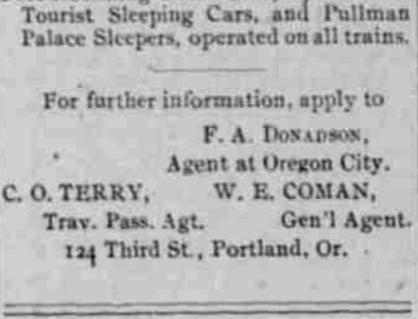
