A KING PRO TEM. Sweden's New Ruler a Prince of Boldness and Decision.

Crown Prince Gustavus, who is now ruler of Sweden pro tem, while King Oscar is in Baden recovering his health, is by no means a young and inexperienced princeling.



It is expected that the crown prince will carry things with an iron hand and that any more nonsense from the Norwegian storthing will result in a show of force.

Prince Gustavus is very unpopular in both Sweden and Norway. When he was attending the public schools with his younger brother, Prince Oscar, he was reserved and cold.

Although he does not arouse much enthusiasm in Stockholm, he is liked rather well in the neighborhood of Tullgaru castle, where he spends his summers.

The crown princess and future empress of Sweden was the Princess Victoria, daughter of the Grand Duke of Baden. The heir apparent and his wife have three children—Prince Gustav Adolf, heir presumptive and duke of Scania, 17 years old; Prince Carl Wilhelm, duke of Sodermanland, 15 years old, and Prince Erik Ludvig Albert, 10 years old.
