WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Admiral Geo. W. Dewey and Mrs. Mildred Hazen were married at the rectory of St. Paul's Catholic church in this city, shortly before 10 o'clock this morning.

Arrangements for the wedding were made with all the secrecy which has attended the whole affair.
