### ANNUAL REPORT

Of the Board of Water Commissioners of Oregon City for the Term Ending December 31st, 1899.

OREGON CITY, OREGON, JANUARY 1st, 1900.

To the Hon., the Mayor and City Council of Oregon City, Oregon.

In compliance with the city charter we herewith submit our Annual Report regarding the condition and finances of the City Water Works. six new tappings have been made during the year at a net profit of \$1.47. Owing to the increased cost of pipe the tapping fee of \$5.00 charged consumers,

Larry covers the average cost. The city has received since July 1st, 1895, \$6,675.52 as part of the earnings from the City Water Works. There remains \$250.53 still due the city which the board will pay in lumber, the same being taken in payment for the old four plunger ; ump of which the board retains ownership until paid in full.

he average expense of operating the water works for the past two years has 1 en \$238.81 per month which includes all improvements, repairs, salaries, comprissions, interest on bonds and other expenses.

Regarding a new water supply we will state that as it was found impracticable to bring water by gravity from the Clackamas River as was fully set forth in our July report, we have in the meantime investigated the Gard Spring, about 10 miles portreast of the city, and upon careful measurement of the water flowing from the springs and two smaller streams, on October 6th, 1899, we found but 648,000 \$ 1100 s flowing in 24 hours. There are other springs in this neighborhood but the combined flow would hardly furnish the city at the present time and there pages be an ample supply in sight before it would be wise to locate any expensive paperine. Owing to this unusually damp season and the early hard rains in Augthe it is questionable what the springs would gauge in a dry season, consequently it is a bad time to decide the merits of a water supply. There is one other reason why the delay has been of advantage and that is regarding the cost of water pipe, which has advanced from 25 to 50 per cent. The board is of the opinion that a graves supply within the reach of the city is still possible but it will require a care of it vestigation and survey to determine what is best in this direction, and that cannot be accomplished before this coming summer; then with cheaper pipe it is hoped that rapid progress may be made for a new supply.
