

ANNUAL SCHOOL MEETING.

Total Expenses of District 62 During 1899 Were \$13,000.

On Monday evening the annual meeting of school district No. 62 was held. The meeting was called to order by the chairman of the board, C. H. Caulfield.

We have gone over this estimate carefully and have included nothing that we do not consider essential to the welfare of the district.

Two hundred dollars for school supplies will not more than cover the necessary expenditures during the year.

We have inserted an item of fifty dollars for shingling the annex to the Barclay building which is in bad condition and has been giving trouble for the last two years and must now be re-shingled.
