The tall chimney of the Grant smelter is an object of interest to every visitor of Denver. It is by far the tallest smokestack in the United States and has but two rivals in the world. The following facts will give the reader an adequate idea of the immensity of this chimney: It is 352 feet 4 inches in height. There are 1,943,000 bricks in this immense shaft. Its weight above the foundation is 12,376,500 pounds. Its pressure at the base is 100 pounds to the square inch, and the total wind pressure against it in a gale would be 306,200 pounds. The diameter at the base is 33 feet and at the top 20 feet. Denver Post.
