STATE REPUBLICAN BY 10,000.

Clackamas County Divides Honors-500 Yotes Short.

Proclaim to the world that Oregon's June election was a complete triumph fus, 1397; majority for Tongue, 514. for republican principles. While Clackamas county has divided her honors about equally between fusion and republicanism, yet there is that healthful legislative, state and congressional jority for Baily, 280. but a sweeping McKinley victory in 1940; Allen, rep, 1771; majority for November.

The state of Oregon has gone republican by increased majorities over '98 as 1536; Milner, fus 1120; majority for is seen by the cases of Wolverton for Dresser, 416. supreme judge and Bailey for Dairy and Food commissioner. Their majorities far exceed the vote of two years ago while the war spirit was alive to swell the republican vote to abnormal propor-

For Congressman, Tongue in the First district has a plurality of 8,000 votes, while in 1898 his plurality was but 2037. In the Second district Moody's plurality is 8200, whereas in 1898 he won by only 6657. These figures show that it has been a notable republican victory. Local issues mixed in the election of members of the legislature, so that the increase i republican vote is not so apparent in those officers, but the legislature is strongly republican. From only one county of the state has the complete unofficial return been reported-Benton. For all others, including Multnomah, the figures are more or less incomplete.
