In the matter of closing the Porter road in district No 10—It is ordered by the board that the supervisor of said district be ordered to open said road where it has been closed up by one Warner until said D. F. Warner petitions to change said road at his own expense.

In the matter of extending the time for payment of 1899 taxes—On request of the sheriff, it is ordered by the board that the time for the payment of the 1899 taxes without cost be extended until August 1st, 1900.

In the matter of the mistake of supervisor of road district No 18, in reporting his time for May as supervisor of said district—It is ordered by the board that said mistake be rectified and the clerk is hereby ordered to issue a road warrant in favor of Ed Hornshuh for \$25.

M. Beck for a tax rebate—The board being fully advised, it is ordered that the sheriff make a reduction so as to allow said Mrs. Beck a rebate of \$7 on her taxes for the year of 1899.

In the matter of the appropriation of the bicycle fund for paths from Barlow and Canby, New Era and Oregon City. The board being fully advised, it is ordered that \$125 be appropriated for said path.
