

DIMICK FOR MAYOR

Independent Citizens Name their Ticket By Acclamation.

Pursuant to a call issued by Chairman A. S. Dresser, the Independent Citizens party held a mass convention at Shively's hall Tuesday night, for the purpose of nominating a municipal ticket, comprising a mayor and five councilmen.

Promptly at 8 o'clock Temporary Chairman A. S. Dresser rapped for order, and upon motion of F. T. Griffith Mr. Dresser was made permanent chairman, and Ernest Rands was chosen secretary.

Dresser then stated the object of the call, after which a motion of Bruce C. Curry was sustained which designated the order of business as per call of convention.

The chairman announced that nominations for mayor were now in order, and the name of Grant B. Dimick, of Ward No. 3 was presented by John Bradley and seconded by W. H. Young. No other name was placed in nomination and the secretary was instructed to cast the ballot of the convention for G. B. Dimick.

Lynn E. Jones, of Ward No. 1, the present incumbent, was made the unanimous choice of the convention without opposition for the office of treasurer, E. E. Charman presenting his name.

At this juncture, Franklin T. Griffith urged that it was eminently fitting before the convention dissolved itself into ward divisions, to hear from the candidate for the mayoralty. Dimick came forward and in a few well-chosen words transmitted his ideas of an ideal city government.

He started out by thanking the convention for the honor conferred upon him, and promised, if elected, a good, clean administration. He had no criticism against the present mayor and corporation. He further promised, if elected in conjunction with good councilmen, he would insure a good city government, economically administered.

The convention then dissolved into ward delegations. Ward No. 1—Wheeler Church was made chairman, F. T. Griffith, secretary. Dr. J. W. Powell was nominated for the 3-year term and Bruce Zornwalt for the 1-year term, acclamation.

Ward No. 2—A. S. Dresser was made chairman and T. W. Sullivan, secretary. Wm. Sheehan was nominated for the 1-year term by acclamation. For the 3-year term the names of S. F. Scripture and E. E. Charman were presented, and upon a vote resulted in favor of Charman by a ballot of 27 to 14.

Ward No. 3—John Lewellen was made chairman and Ed. Scott was nominated for a 3-year term by acclamation. Chairman Dresser was then empowered to appoint a committee of five to conduct the election of the ticket nominated. Mr. Dresser was further empowered to use his own discretion as to the time of making the appointments.

On motion the convention then adjourned.
