

HARDING FOR MAYOR.

Non-Partisans. Name Their Ticket for City Officials.

Pursuant to a call issued by C. H. Dye, the non-partisan party met in mass convention Tuesday night at the Willamette hotel, to select a ticket for the coming year.

The temporary Chairman C. H. Dye, who was made permanent chairman, but resigned in favor of Charles Albright, who was made permanent chairman of the organization for the ensuing year.

Chris Schuebel was chosen secretary by acclamation.

The chairman then announced that the order of business would be followed as per call of meeting, and stated that nominations for mayor were now in order.

George A. Harding was then placed in nomination by Charles Albright and received every vote of the convention.

Linn E. Jones, the present incumbent and nominee of the independent citizens' convention, was endorsed for the office of treasurer.

After adopting the following resolutions, the convention dissolved itself into ward divisions for the purpose of nominating councilmen:

Whereas, Our present rate of taxation is burdensome and a menace to the future growth and prosperity of our city, and the tendency now seems to be to increase rather than diminish our municipal burdens; therefore,

Resolved, That we ask the candidates of this convention to pledge themselves, if elected, to use their best endeavors,

First, to reduce the city's current expenses to its current income;

Second, to improve our city water system as far as prudent expenditure of our means will permit, but in no event to increase our bonded indebtedness beyond the limit already fixed by law;

Third, to see that appointive officers shall honestly and faithfully perform the duties assigned them, and that no money shall be paid out of the public funds for which there has been no equivalent in service rendered to the city;

Fourth, to see that the laws and ordinances of the city are honestly and impartially enforced without fear or favor.

The ward nominations were as follows:

First ward—Three-year term, Duane Ely; one-year term, H. C. Stevens.

Second ward—Three-year term, C. G. Huntley; one-year term, William Sheehan (endorsed).

Third ward—Three-year term, Ed Scott (endorsed); one-year term, S. B. Francis.

Chairman Albright was empowered to appoint a committee of ten to conduct the forthcoming election.

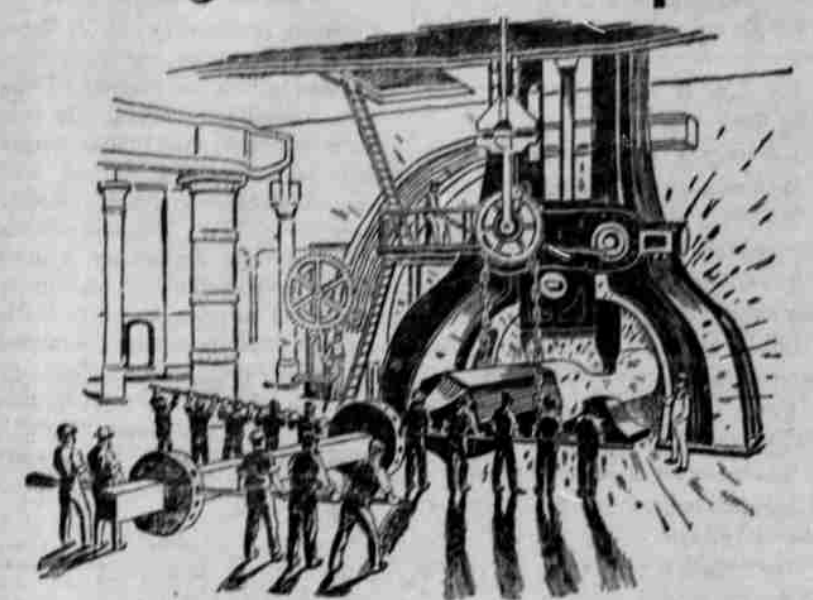
