Saturday, February 16. Congress—There will be no vote on the ship-subsidy bill this session.

Foreign—The British are driving Dewet back from Philippstown.

Domestic—Maurice Thompson, the author, is dead. The Cincinnati Saengerfest Athletic club paid its forfeit to Brady and Martin promoters of the Jeffries-Roblin fight.

Pacific Coast—Sixty-six miners are entombed in a mine near Union, Vancouver Island, with no chance of escape.

Philippines—All volunteers will be home by June 30.

Foreign—Russia has imposed an increased tariff on American imports.

Domestic—A 13-inch gun exploded on the battleship Kearsarge.

Legislatures—Semiannual payment of taxes is one of the features of a bill passed by the Oregon senate.

Pacific Coast—The Great Northern is believed to be getting right of way between Seattle and Tacoma on the way to Portland.

Commercial—There is a scarcity of money in England.

China—Von Waldersee has planned an 80 day expedition to hasten peace negotiations.

Foreign—The Russian minister's move in imposing discriminating duty on American manufactures is to test the nation's ability to stand a tariff war.

Domestic—Mrs. Nation was arrested three times Sunday for joint-wrecking, but is now out on bond.

Pacific Coast—Nine persons in Spokane county jail overpowered the jailor and escaped.

Congress—The St. Louis fair appropriation bill was passed by the house.

China—Chaffee will not join the German expedition.

Foreign—Winston Churchill made his first speech in English parliament.

Legislatures—The Portland Charter bill passed the Oregon senate.

A bill to apply local option to gambling in Idaho, was defeated in the house.

Pacific Coast—The fire in the Union, B. C., mines has been extinguished and the entombed miners will soon be reached.

Wednesday, February 20. Congress—The senate rejected the hazing provisions of the West Point bill.

Philippines—Employees of two Manila companies have been arrested for aiding the rebels.

China—Conger has been instructed to proceed against the proposed expedition.

Foreign—A nationalist member of the English house of commons, attempted to deliver a speech in Irish, but was called down.

Domestic—A saloon raid at Millwood, Kansas, resulted in the killing of a woman.

Legislatures—Portland charter bill passed Oregon senate.
