Chief of Police Gets Peremptory Orders From the Council.

At the regular monthly meeting of the city council Wednesday evening, the question of taxing the thousands of dogs in Oregon City came up for action.

In the absence of Mayor Dimick, who is sick at home with the measles, President Albright occupied the chair.

"Where is the chief of police?" "Here I am," responded that worthy gentleman.

"Where is the dog catcher?" asked President Albright.

"In jail, your honor," answered the chief.

"That is unfortunate," mused the president of the council, tapping lightly on his desk with the end of a lead pencil.

It was finally decided to instruct the chief of police to arrest all owners of dogs who failed to pay the tax provided by law.

The time of the council was taken up with routine business. The finance committee reported that as the Bank of Oregon City had offered to pay 3 per cent for the use of city money, that bank was made the depository of the public funds.

In accordance with a report from the finance committee, it was decided to issue \$30,000 in redemption bonds, due in 20 years, at 5 per cent interest.

The ordinance relating to the building of a new sewer was read for the first time and ordered published.

An order was made to open the alley in block 64.

The bids for furnishing lumber for the ensuing year were opened and it was found that Lindsey & Son were the lowest bidders.

The council adjourned to meet Monday evening April 22, when the bond issue will be adjusted.
