Important Ruling by a Wisconsin Circuit Judge.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE SUSTAINED.

Court Says That the Art of Healing Can be Carried on by Christian Selentists.

MILWAURKE, Wis. April 18 - Judge Eugene S. Elliott, in the circuit court today, decided that Christian Scientists are not liable to prosecution under the state medical law. The court ruled that the scientists can no more be held for practicing medicine by their means of healing by prayer than can a minister who prays at the bedside of the sick and receives therefor a fee, either directly or indirectly. The case was that of the state against Crecentia Arries and Emma Nicholas, Christian Scientists, who treated a child named Grosenback, affleted with diphtheria and who died from the disea e.
