

**MRS. DYE RETURNS**  
From a Three Months Trip in Eastern Cities.

**COLLECTED VALUABLE MATERIAL.**  
For Her Forthcoming Work On the Lewis and Clark Pacific Coast Expedition.

Mrs. Eva Emery Dye, author of "McLoughlin and Old Oregon," which has run through three editions, returned Sunday from an Eastern trip, where she spent nearly three months in search of material for her forthcoming book on Lewis and Clark. Leaving Oregon City March 27, she went to St. Paul and from there to Chicago, Detroit, Buffalo, New York City, Boston, Philadelphia, Washington, Louisville, Indianapolis, St. Louis, Rock Island, Bozeman, Montana,

Helena and Madison, Wisconsin, all on business connected with the subject of her new book. She visited all the great historical collections that containing anything about Lewis and Clark and met all of the descendants of General Clark. She stayed two weeks in Madison consulting the Draper manuscripts which were collected from the Clark family more than 40 years ago. The manuscripts are in the University of Wisconsin which has the finest collection of Americana in the world.

Mrs. Dye talked with several persons who had known Clark and in St. Louis found some old letters, giving a description of Clark's wedding trip. She met Clark's only two grandsons, William Hancock Clark, of Detroit, and John O'Fallon Clark, of St. Louis, and visited the Clark's old home.  
Meriwether Lewis died shortly after he returned from the Pacific coast expedition. He never married and left no direct descendants. Mrs. Dye obtained from his grand-nephew manuscript which contains a great deal of original matter about Lewis that has never been published.  
Mrs. Dye will spend the summer at her home in this city. She is taking a much needed rest but will soon resume her work.

## G.A.R. ENCAMPMENT

Meets at Forest Grove Wednesday of Next Week.

WILL BE IN SESSION FOUR DAYS.

Many Prominent People Will Be Present—Washington County Veterans Association Hold Annual Reunion June 22, 23 and 24.

The Twentieth Annual Encampment of the Department of Oregon, Grand Army of the Republic will meet next Wednesday at Forest Grove and remain in session four days. The following circular has been issued by the committee of arrangements:

Forest Grove, Ore., May 25, 1901.  
To the Comrades of the G. A. R. and Ladies of the W. R. C.:

The Department of Oregon, G. A. R., holds its Twentieth Annual Encampment in Forest Grove, June 22 to 25th, inclusive, 1901.

The Washington County Veterans Association holds its annual reunion June 22, 23 and 24. Thus we will have a seven days outing in camp.

It is urgently requested that as many as can make it convenient, come here and go into camp as early as the morning of June 22, or what would be still better, the 20th or 21st. Fine exercises will be held during the day and evening of each of the three days reunion of the Washington County Veterans Association, and others going into camp here early. We will thus be established in camp and can materially assist to make other comrades and their families "at home" as they arrive later on with the large crowds that are sure to come to attend the Department meetings.

We have one of the finest camp grounds on the coast; lighted with electricity and supplied with an abundance of the purest water. Tents, wood and straw, will be furnished, all free.

Bring your blankets, cooking utensils and mess chest (well filled or you can fill it here), or if you desire you can get meals on the grounds, or at private homes, at 25 cents each. The two hotels have agreed to a \$1.00 per day rate and many private houses will entertain at not to exceed 25c per meal and a same for beds. All will be accommodated.

Those coming by team can get pasture for the week of the Encampment at very reasonable rates. Stabling with hay and oats per day, 75c for team.

An abundance of horse feed, or groceries and provisions, can be had of the merchants of Forest Grove at the every-day prices prevailing at ordinary times. In fact, no pains will be spared to make this one of the most pleasant encampments ever held in the state.

We will have with us during the Encampment: The Commander-in-Chief of the G. A. R., Major Leo Rassieur, of St. Louis, Mo.; The National President of the W. R. C., Mrs. Mary L. Carr, of Longmont, Col.; The Governor of Oregon, Hon. T. T. Geer; The State Grange; Oregon Pioneers and Native Sons and Daughters; Knights of Pythias of Oregon School children of Washington County; Mexican War Veterans; Indian War Veterans; Spanish and Philippine War Veterans; Oregon Association of Iowa Veterans; Washington County Veterans Association; G. A. R. and W. R. C. of Oregon; and many notable visitors from abroad.

Second Day—Sunday, June 23, 1901. Grand Union services of the churches of Forest Grove and vicinity at the camp grounds. Rev. Dr. Kautner, salern; Rev. Dr. Rockwell and Rev. Dr. Gormley of Portland will be present and assist the local clergy at these services. Forenoon, 10:30; Afternoon, 2:30; Evening, 7:30.

Third Day—Monday, June 24, 1901. "Grange Day." Forenoon—Patriotic Exercises. Afternoon—Program by the State Grange. Evening—Camp fire.

Fourth Day—Tuesday, June 25, 1901. "Oregon Pioneers and Native Sons and Daughters' Day." Forenoon—Receiving and locating delegates and visitors to the Dept. G. A. R. and W. R. C. Afternoon—Program by the Oregon Pioneers and Native Sons and Daughters. Evening—Reception of National and State G. A. R. and W. R. C.

Fifth Day—Wednesday, June 26, 1901. "Knights of Pythias Day." Forenoon—Grand Street Parade and Reception of School Children of Washington County. Afternoon—The K. of P will present that greatest of all fraternal plays "Damon and Pythias." Evening—Program by Pacific University.
