A comparison of the treasury statements of money in circulation in the years 1896 and 1901 shows what has taken place.

Farms and Farming.

Farms in Clackamas. [Pacific Farmer.]

A. W. Cook, a native son, engaged in mixed farming near Damascus, has a herd of nine grade Jersey cows, all good butter producers. Mr. Cook is one of the directors of the Co-operative Creamery Association, lately organized, and is to begin active operations the coming fall at the old hatchery on the Clackamas. Mr. Cook is road supervisor of road district No. 3, including Damascus precinct, and has been acting in this capacity for the past ten years, and is doing excellent road work.

E. Tethill, a native of West Liberty, Ia., is in mixed farming on a 100 acre farm near Damascus. His plan to rid land of French sorrel is to plant plover corn as green soiling crop, and sow the corn fallow with winter wheat, and after the next grain harvest, as soon as the ground is in condition, to plow under the stubble and pasture well with sheep during the fall and winter, plowing and cultivating well again in the spring, and sow to oats and clover.
