An ordinance authorizing the sale and conveyance of certain real property in Oregon City.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder be and they are hereby authorized to execute deeds conveying all the right, title and interest of Oregon City in and to the hereinafter described real property to the parties and for the considerations herein-after mentioned.

Section 2. To the Roman Catholic Archbishop of the diocese of Oregon, for the consideration of \$31,000 all of lots one (1) of block twenty-two (22) of Oregon City and all that portion of lot No. eight [8] of said block twenty-two [22] described as follows:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of said lot No. eight [8]; thence westerly along line of Tenth street 20 feet; thence southerly at right angles 33 feet; thence easterly at right angles 20 feet; thence northerly at right angles 33 feet to the place of beginning.

Section 3. To Portland General Electric Company, for the consideration of \$241.80; all of the following described real property situated in the City of Oregon City to wit: Beginning at a point on a projection of the east boundary of Main street 32 1/2 feet southerly from the southwest or most westerly corner of block 29 in said Oregon City; running thence southerly along said projection of Main street 44 feet; thence easterly at right angles with the last line 100 feet; thence northerly at right angles 44 feet; thence westerly at right angles 100 feet to the place of beginning.

ORDINANCE NO.—

An ordinance providing for the lighting of Oregon City and authorizing execution of an agreement with Portland General Electric Company thereto.

Oregon City does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder of Oregon City be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into an agreement, on behalf of Oregon City, with the Portland General Electric Company, providing for the lighting of Oregon City for the term of six years from July 1, 1901.

Section 2. Such agreement shall provide that during such term Oregon City shall use and its Portland General Electric Company shall furnish for use within the present limits of Oregon City, electric current for not less than nominal two thousand candle power electric lamps and for not less than 25 twenty-five candle power electric incandescent lamps.

Section 3. The number of lamps, are or incandescent, may be increased at any time, and for such increased number Oregon City shall pay the same rates. At no time during said period shall the number of lamps, are or incandescent, be reduced to less than 18 arc and 25 incandescent lamps.

Section 4. All are lamps and all incandescent street lamps shall be kept lighted at all times between twilight and dawn during said period, and current for all incandescent lamps in public buildings shall be available at all times.

Section 5. Portland General Electric Company shall furnish all poles, wires, are and incandescent lamps and shall place such additional arc and incandescent lamps where the same may be required by Oregon City, provided, however, that the said Portland General Electric Co. shall not be required to erect any incandescent lamp at a greater distance than 600 feet from any other incandescent lamp used for street lighting, under said agreement, nor any arc lamp at a greater distance than 1200 feet from any other arc lamp used for street lighting, under said agreement. Oregon City shall defray the cost of all removals and relocations.
