THE POPULATION OF THE WORLD.

Some interesting estimates of the world's population are given in The Current Cyclopaedia for December. This is placed at a billion and a half, distributed as follows:

The population of the leading countries of Europe according to recent censuses is given as follows:

Table with 2 columns: Country, Population. Includes Austria-Hungary (46,900,835), France (38,641,333), Germany (56,345,014), Italy (32,449,754), Russia (106,184,607), United Kingdom (41,454,219).

The totals for the empires with large dependencies represented in the foregoing table are: France, 94,781,014; Germany, 71,032,014; Russia, 128,932,173; and United Kingdom 590,000,000.

According to an estimate of the Washington Bureau of Statistics no less than 500,000,000 of the earth's inhabitants are colonial, and of these colonial less than 15,000,000, or 3 per cent, are composed of the people of the governing country.

Roughly speaking the English-speaking population of the earth numbers 133,000,000 being outnumbered only by the inhabitants of China and India.

FARMS AND FARMING

NEW TRING IN SILAGE. Interesting Discovery Made at the State Agricultural College.

Hon. Benton Killin, who is chairman of the station committee of the Board of Regents of the State Agricultural College, at Corvallis, returned from there, says the Oregonian, highly elated at the success of some experiments with silage.

The experiments began 18 months ago, with a view of producing sweet silage, and were first carried on in cans and jars.

The silos were filled in the usual way, and then thoroughly cooked by steam from the boiler used to run the farm engine.

Under the old system there was lost by fermentation 10 per cent of the food value of the corn. There was from 3 to 4 per cent lost by reason of indigestibility.

This process bids fair to be one of the most valuable discoveries ever made for the dairy and stock industries.
