Although Congress assembled on the first Monday in December last, it had been in session, prior to Monday, Jan 6, only eight days. Yet in that time it started an unprecedented amount of work. To record this work required 175 pages of the House Journal, a publication of the same sized page as the Congressional Record. Each page contained 1700 words, or a total of 297,500 words which the journal clerks were required to record, being 234 words for every minute of time occupied during the session. The total number of bills introduced in the House was 7623, an excess of more than 2000 over any other previous session. Of these bills 2,970 were referred to a single committee-that on invalid In the last Congress the pensions. In the last Congress, the Fifty-sixth, the total number of bills introduc. d in the House was 14,339 for the entire Congress.

A F Stokes 8 F Scriptt The last year of the Nineteenth Century was the banner one for invention in the United States. The number of patents issued during the twelve months of 1900 exceeds the record of any previous year in the history of the American patent system and surpasses the annual issue of every other patent bureau in the world. While this increase has been particularly notable along such linessuch as land transportation by steam and electricity, electrical appliances, improved machinery for industrial uses, and patents designed to simplify machinery already in use-it has been also very comprehensive and includes every phase of industrial activity. In the career of the Patent Office such a general increase in the number of certificates issued has been found to indicate a general condition of high wages and good crops,
