At 10:30 o'clock Wednesday morning the Republican County Convention was called to order in Willamette Hall by Chairman J. U. Campbell of the county central committee. The delegates were seated in alphabetical order with Abernethy in the front row.

Chairman Campbell made an introductory speech, advising a harmonious convention. Recorder Tom P. Randall placed Hon. A. S. Dresser in nomination for temporary chairman. He was elected by acclamation. He was escorted to the chair by Delegates Randall and Hedges and was introduced by Chairman Campbell. In taking the chair Mr. Dresser thanked the convention for the honor conferred upon him, and asked for the further pleasure of the convention.

E. C. Hackett, of Abernethy, placed Franklin T. Griffith in nomination for temporary secretary. He was unanimously elected.

Upon motion of Mr. Wright the chairman was authorized to appoint a committee on credentials.

Mr. Campbell moved that the chair appoint a committee on platform and resolutions.

Upon motion the chair was empowered to appoint a committee on order of business.

Hon. Gordon E. Hayes made a rousing address to the convention while the committee on credentials was deliberating. His speech was greeted with cheers and applause. He paid a glowing tribute to Lincoln.

State Senator George C. Brownell was called and made a stirring address. He advised an equally distributed ticket over all the county. His speech was enthusiastically received. He alluded to the promises made and fulfilled, and spoke of the work accomplished in the legislature. He challenged the opposition to show where the party had neglected to perform all the pledges made in the platform two years ago. He promised to work for an 8-hour-a-day law and to endeavor to have railroad mileage reduced from four to three cents per mile. He spoke of the great honor and privilege of being permitted to be an instrument for the election of Senator John H. Mitchell.

Before the noon adjournment of the convention, R. J. Schuebel made a short talk. He said that he left the Republican party to go into the Populistic fold, but the promised reform was a myth and he was back in the old party and would support the ticket.

The convention adjourned until 1:30, when it re-convened. Some little time was spent in readjusting the seats of the various delegations.

A resolution, instructing the delegates to the state convention to vote for and use all honorable means to further the candidacy of L. L. Porter for state printer, was adopted.

The committee on platform made the following report, which was adopted:

PLATFORM.
The Republican Party in County Convention assembled, in Oregon City Clackamas County, Oregon, March 26, 1902, congratulates the people of this county upon the general prosperous condition of our common country, as well as that of our own immediate vicinity.

We deeply deplore the untimely death of our well beloved President McKinley, whose memory is endeared to the hearts of all citizens, and we hereby endorse the wise statesmanship of his successor, President Roosevelt, in his efforts to carry out the policies so ably begun by President McKinley.

We endorse and commend the action of President Roosevelt in his efforts to control the trusts, and to secure to labor an adequate recognition in its disputes with the capitalistic classes, and we hereby assure him of our cordial sympathy and support.

We endorse and commend the action of our national representatives in championing the Nicaragua Canal Bill, the Mitchell-Kahn Chinese Exclusion Bill, and the bill to pension Indian war veterans, and hope for the speedy passage of all these measures.

We demand a constitutional amendment for the election of United States Senators by direct vote of the people.

Believing, as we do, that all people should participate as far as possible in the making of the laws by which they are governed, we heartily endorse and commend to the careful consideration of all the electors, the constitutional amendment known as the initiative and referendum, and urge upon all speakers and campaign workers to bring the matter prominently before the voters.

We endorse the action of the members of the last legislature in supporting Hon. John H. Mitchell for the United States Senate.

We commend the action of Senators Brownell and Porter and Representatives Kruse, Talbert and Dresser for their support of what is known as the precinct assessor law, and the passage of the thirty days exemption law for the wage earners of the State of Oregon, and their action in refusing to raise county salaries.

We instruct the nominees of this convention to both branches of the legislature, that if elected, they will make an earnest effort to obtain legislation which will cause control of the school textbooks by the State of Oregon and their sale to the people at actual cost.

To obtain legislation by which a portion of the State revenues may be raised by a graduated income tax and a graduated inheritance tax.

To obtain legislation reducing the passenger fare in the State of Oregon to three cents per mile.

To obtain legislation constituting eight hours a day's work throughout the State.
