THE TWO-HEADED ASS.

The Citizen's Party of Clackamas County has endorsed the initiative and referendum amendment following the endorsement of the amendment by the Republican state and county conventions. From the Appeal to Reason we quote some facts that show up the fallacy of alleged support of the measure by the Democrats who formed the Citizens Party. They go to show that the endorsement was made merely to get in the band wagon. The Appeal shows that no Democratic legislature in any state ever passed a direct legislation law. The Republicans of Oregon twice passed the measure. They have fostered it and stood forth in its support and it is in the nature of a steal when it appears in a Democratic platform:

Mr. Bryan (who is greater than his paper), gently elaps the Appeal, (which is greater than its editor), in the face because it speaks of the tendency of the Solid South to become Republican, and the hopelessness of any change for the better from the Democrats. The Appeal turns the other cheek also, but still insist that the Democrats in no state where they have the power have made a single move to put into operation a single principle of the Kansas City platform. In no state have the Democrats passed a Direct Legislation law; in no state have they passed a law freeing the people from the clutches of the trusts; in no state have they passed a law protecting the laboring people from the greed of private employers; in no state have Democratic officials proven a friend to the laboring people—the south being especially the worst section on labor, where it is treated worse than ever chattel slaves. The Democratic party is dead and will never elect another president. In 1904 the party will split as it did in 1890, because the ruling men in the party work hand in hand with the plutocrats. The Democratic party is controlled by the rich men in it. There are Democrats who favor municipal ownership and direct legislation, and will admit, but there are Republicans who favor them also; in fact the Republican party of Oregon has twice passed a law submitting direct legislation to the people next June, and it will become a law. IN NO DEMOCRATIC STATE HAS SUCH A LAW BEEN SUBMITTED TO THE PEOPLE. The Democrats who favor a change of conditions will have to leave that party to get it. And they will leave that party. Of what use is a platform when the party refuses to carry it out when they have the power?

This week a representative of the Canby Item, an alleged newspaper of no paid circulation, published in Portland, has been interviewing the candidates for the various county offices, offering them space in his valuable (?) paper, with a portrait, for the small sum of \$15. We do not know whether or not any of the candidates have been caught by this grafter but we do know that any nominee, be he Republican, Citizen, Socialist or Prohibition, who p'ngles up \$15 or any other sum for the support of the Canby Item, is nothing less than a sucker. The paper has no standing in this or any other community. It is not published at Canby and contains no news of Clackamas County. It is printed in Portland by a boiler plate firm and its

The proposed Initiative and Referendum amendment to the Constitution of Oregon will appear on the official ballot as "Initiative and Referendum amendment" with the words "Yes" and "No." In order that the people may be familiar with this form before election day, it may be better for friends of the measure to refer to it always as the Initiative and Referendum amendment, and in using the term Direct Legislation, to explain that it refers to this amendment in Oregon. Direct Legislation is a general term, meaning all forms of direct voting by the people including candidates as well as measures. Initiative and Referendum are the names of that limited part of Direct Legislation that refers to the proposing and making of laws by direct vote by the people.

The Citizens' ticket in Clackamas County will in all probability be as big a farce as a similarly constituted ticket was in this county two years ago. The

Republicans carried the county by increased majorities. That will no doubt be the experience of Clackamas Republicans. The people don't want an aggregation in power that is not responsible, and they look upon such movements as started and carried on for office alone and not in the interest of the people of the county.—Salem Statesman.

EAGLE TO SCREAM

Oregon City Will Have a Fourth of July Celebration.

Meeting Called For Next Monday Evening To Formulate a Definite Plan of Action.

George W. Grace, L. Adams, M. Michael, C. G. Huntley and Elmer E. Charman, a committee appointed by the Retail Merchants' Association, to ascertain the sentiment of the business men in relation to a Fourth of July celebration, are making an active canvass of the city and are doing all in their power to boom the project. Aside from the patriotic sentiment involved in a celebration, it means hundreds of dollars to the merchants that would otherwise go elsewhere. Since July 4, 1898, when the majority of the Oregon City boys were in the Philippines, there has been no celebration, and the citizens are just waking up to the fact that it is not good policy to allow the years to go by and see the people of Oregon City and surrounding towns go to outside celebrations. Secretary Schnebel, of the Retail Merchants' Association, said yesterday that it was the intention of the association to conduct the celebration on a large scale. A meeting has been called for next Monday evening in the courtroom to formulate a plan of action. Everybody interested in a Fourth of July celebration is invited to attend and submit their views regarding the proposition and the manner in which it should be carried out.
