REGULAR SESSIONCity Dads Vote \$175 For Fourth
of July Celebration.

MORE WAGES FOR STREET WORK

Petitions Presented From 300 Residents Asking For Passage of a
Curfew Ordinance.

The council met Wednesday night with all of the members present.

The wages of a teamster, with team, for street work, was increased to \$4 per day, to take effect after June 1.

Petition of property owners asking that a sewer district be created and that main and branch sewers be laid in that portion of the city between 8th and 14th streets and west of Van Buren street, now without a sewer, or for such portion of that district and to include any additional territory, which a proper survey shall disclose to be for the best interests of the residents of that section and the general health and welfare of the city, was referred to a committee of the second ward to investigate, with power to employ the city engineer to make a preliminary survey if necessary, and to report at next meeting.

The council appropriated \$175 to be placed in the hands of the fire commission to be used as prizes in the firemen's tournament and hose contest on July 4.

The committee on health and police was authorized to purchase a site on build a pesthouse.

The city treasurer was ordered to pay \$1000 from the road fund to the general fund.

Petition from 300 residents was presented asking the council to establish by ordinance an hour at night after which it shall be unlawful for minors under the age of 16 years to be on the streets or abroad, unless accompanied by a suitable guardian over the age of 21 years. The petition recommended the hour of nine o'clock be fixed for April, May, June, July, August, September and October, and that the hour of eight o'clock be fixed for November, December, January, February and March. The matter was referred to the finance committee to prepare an ordinance and to report at next meeting.

The recorder was instructed to notify the telephone, telegraph and electric light companies to paint all poles which are now unpainted, as required by ordinance.

Petition of street workers to raise their wages from \$1.75 to \$2.00 per day was allowed after June 1.

Petition of residents of Falls View stating that G. Reddaway having closed the stairway and board walk leading from the head of Fifth street to Falls View, and there being no other outlet for the people to reach the city and for children to go to school except by way of the Fourth street steps, the council is petitioned to provide a proper outlet to the city by way of Fifth street. The matter was referred to the street committee to investigate and report at next meeting.
