OREGON CITY WINS THE GAME.

Beats Monograms in Portland By a Score of 2 to 1.

The Oregon City baseball nine defeated the Monograms Sunday on the professional grounds in Portland by a score of 2 to 1.

The game was a lively one. Graham, who pitched for Oregon City, played a consistent game throughout, and Davis, on third, was the bright particular star. His fielding was accurate and he scored both runs made by his side. The scores were made on wild throws to first.

In the third inning, with Wickham on second and Fleming on third, Schmeer made a long drive to center field, but Happ missed the ball, and before he could recover it Wickham had crossed the plate. The inning closed with a neat double play from Lee to McFarland, retiring Rankin and Fleming.

Califf made as pretty a play ever seen on a baseball field. He ran about 30 yards and caught a man out. The fielding was sensational. Catcher Martin rose from a sickbed to catch the game and notwithstanding this, put up a game worthy of a professional. Lee got everything that came his way and his fielding was exceptional. McFarland was, as usual, steady and reliable. He has not made a single error this season, which is a remarkable record.

Van Leavitt, at shortstop, put up a snappy game for Oregon City, while Zan and Oliver did effective batting for the Monograms. Neither side scored after the third inning. The score:

*Tie game at Oregon City on May 4. Next Sunday afternoon Oregon City will play Upchurch, of Portland, at Wilamette Park. The game will be called promptly at 2:30 P. M., and after 1 o'clock cars will leave the west end of the suspension bridge every 15 minutes. The general admission will be 25 cents and this also includes admission to the grandstand. An excursion will be given from up river points on the steamer Moloc and a large crowd is expected from Dayton, Missions, Newberg, Champeog, Botteville and Wilsonville. The boat will land at the ball grounds and return after the game.

ANNUAL ENCAMPMENT.

Oregon National Guard Will Camp Near Albany, July 17 to 24.

The annual encampment of the Oregon National Guard will be held this year near Albany. The entire brigade will camp from July 17 to July 24, inclusive, just outside the southwestern limits of the city, not far from the Southern Pacific Depot. There is a nice large grove near which the tents may be pitched, and the adjoining field is large and smooth enough for good drilling. It will be an easy matter to provide plenty of good water for the camp. The citizens of Albany will begin immediately to make arrangements so that the camp will be convenient and pleasant in every respect for Oregon's citizen soldiers.

The entire brigade, under command of Brigadier-General Charles F. Beebe, will be present at this encampment. The brigade consists of 18 companies of infantry, two troops of cavalry and one battery of artillery, besides staff officers and hospital corps, and is composed as follows: The Third Regiment, consisting of Companies A, of Oregon City, and B, C, D, E, F and G, of Portland. The Fourth Regiment, consisting of Companies A and C, of Eugene; B, of Ashland; D, of Woodburn; E, of Roseburg; F, of Salem; G, of Albany; and H, of Grant's Pass. The first separate battalion, consisting of Companies A, of Baker City; B, of LaGrande and D, of The Dalles; Troop A, of Lebanon; Troop B, of Sumpster; Battery A, of Portland; Third Regiment Hospital Corps, of Portland, and Fourth Regiment Hospital Corps, of Albany.
