Revolution. His address was a fine effort. We shook hands with General Porter and Count Rochambeau, listened to Admiral Schley, had punch at intervals, then wound up with a buffet lunch at Raucher's for the sons of veterans who nearly starved at Valley Forge held their meetings at Raucher's, the most recherché feasting place in Washington.

Admiral Schley said that his family had been in all the wars of this country from the beginning, which is true of my own family. My grandfather was surgeon in the old French war as well as the war of the Revolution; a cousin was a general in the war of 1812, at Londy's Lake, Canada, also in the Seminole war, the Mexican war, and was commander in chief when he died, at the opening of the civil war.
