## DEATH OF JACOB RISLEY.

Prominent Clackamas County Man and Pioneer of 1845 Passes Away.

Jacob Swain Risley, one of the most prominent citizens in Clackamas County, died at his home near this city last Saturday morning. Death came suddenly. Mr. Risiey suffered a severe attack of lagrippe last winter and never fully recovered from its effects. Friday night he was selzed with a violent attack of coughing, which resulted in the bursting of a blood vessel in his lung. The end came at 8 o'clock Saturday morning. At his bedside were his children, John and Charles Risley, of Risley's Station, and Mrs. Harvey Starkweather, of Milwaukie.

Mr. Risley was born December 1, 1832, at Delphas, O., and crossed the plains in 1845 with his parents, settling in Yamhill County, near the present site of St. Joe. In 1847 they moved to Ciackamas County, and the father of the deceased took up a homestead and the family have resided there ever since. The property is valuable and is familiar to Oregon City people, being on the line of the Portland City & Oregon Railway, between Oregon City and Milwaukie. On September 20, 1857, Mr. Risley married Miss Mary S. Schoil, who died June 15,

1886

No one man in Clackamas was better Risley. Honest, upright, and with the courage of his convictions, he was universally respected. In politics he was an ardent Democrat, and in 1894 was a candidate for county judge, but was defeated. He took a great interest in matters pertaining to the government of the county, as was becoming in a large property owner, and at all times stood what he considered to be the right. He was a prominent Odd Fellow and was a member of Oswego Lodge, No. 93, and of Falls Encampment, No. 4, I. O. O. F. He was also a member of Milwaukie Grange, Patrons of Husbandry, He owned large property in Portland

The funeral was held Monday was held Monday morning at 10 o'clock under the auspices of the Odd Fellows. Scores of friends of the deceased and of the family were present to pay their respects to the memory of a good man and citizen. The remains were interred in the family plat on the Risley place.

## Mrs. Carl Heiser.

Mrs. Carl Heiser died at Damascus last Friday after a lingering illness of about eight months. Her death was caused by cancerous tumor and she was bedfast seven weeks prior b her death. Mrs. Heiser came to the United States from Germany in 1880. Her husband and seven children preceded her in death. She is survived by three sons: Fritz H. Heiser, Otto F. Heiser and Robert C. Heiser. The latter is a veteran of the Spanish-American war and was with Co. I, Second Oregon Volun-teers, in the Philippines. The funeral of the deceased was held at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon and the interment was in the Damascus cemetery. A prominent part in the ceremonies was taken by the Woodmen of America, of Damascus,
