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RETAIL GROCERS ANNUAL PICNIC

Three Thousand People in the Canemah Park Wednesday.

BASEBALL, SPORTS AND DANCING

Portland Firms Gave Handsome Prizes For Each Event.—Park Was a Garden of Music.

The first annual picnic of the Portland Retail Grocers' Protective Association at Canemah Park Wednesday was attended by three thousand enthusiastic people from Portland and other towns along the line of the Portland City and Oregon Railway Company, which landed passengers directly at the Park Cars running every twenty minutes were well filled at every trip.

The business houses of Oregon City suspended business in honor of the occasion and all classes of people throughout the community showed their approval of the gathering by a large attendance. In the morning the games and events of the day were brought on, the association recently completed an enclosure around the baseball diamond and race track. The track was not in first class condition but was used successfully for every event. The judges were declared by the rules to be absolute arbiters from whom there could be no appeal.

Among the events was a traveling men's race of 200 yards for a box of cigars; prettiest baby under one year, 1st prize, 3 yards crepon silk; grocers' race, 200 yards, prize \$5; girls' race 100 yards; married ladies' race, 100 yards; potato race for men, 25 yards; grocer clerks' race, 200 yards; young ladies' race; sack race; pie eating contest; three-legged race; boys' race under 15 years; fat man's race, 100 yards; greased pole race and swimming contest and at 9 o'clock illumination of the falls. Unfortunately the repair of the breakwater around the falls caused the water to be all turned into the basin and locks and left the cliff over which the river usually pours absolutely barren. The judges of the contest consisted of G. B. Dimick, E. T. Barlow, Geo. T. Howard, Wm. Mc. Glashan, Chas. Albright, W. Harris, L. Clemens, D. Ely, A. Robertson, F. Bush, Wm. Reid, Willis Fisher, Harry Tuttle, Sam Driscoll, Frank Siesland, W. G. Grandall, Ed. Lowell, T. M. McAfee, Ed. Thamer, Jos. C. Gibson and H. H. Samuels. Professionals of all kinds were debarred from the contests.

In the afternoon the city salesmen and retail grocers lined up for baseball. The travelers played Green, Keil, Siech McIntyre, Schoenfeldt, Farrell, Joseph Shaver, Day and Sullivan with Kelleher and Mann substitutes; the grocers played Funk, Kadelier, Raymond, Bennett, Fellows, Pairin, Yates, Dunbar, Gassow with Lang and Gibson substitutes. The game was waged severely and hotly contested through full nine innings with the travelers in the lead at the close and a score something like 25 to 16, the score-keeper being somewhat in doubt about the score. At the pavilion dancing was enjoyed throughout the day and the floor was constantly in motion with from twenty to fifty couples at once, the dance continuing until late in the evening.

The Southern Pacific hand dispensed appropriate music, which, with two orchestras, transformed the park into a musical garden.
