SUPREME COURT DECISIONS.

THE REVOLUTION OF FINLAND.

Since the overthrow of the constitutional rights of Finland was determined upon by the Russian government the efforts to bring it about have been unremitting.

But they have met with a dogged resistance on the part of the Finnish people which must rank as one of the most remarkable struggles for liberty in the world's history.

A late phase in the contest has to do with the description. It seems that although there are severe penalties for refusing to attend the levy the Finns are not terrified by them into obedience.

Furthermore, although the people are law-abiding, popular demonstrations o

disapproval of the government's policy continue to occur. Servile members of the senate, a body that is appointed by the crown, have been hooted in the streets by as-embled crowds.

In the reconstruction of the local government, senators who were loyal to the Finns have been dismissed and their places have been filled by such time servers as those who aroused the public indignation on this occasion.

As there are more than 100,000,000 subjects of the czar in European Russia alone, and as there are only about 2,300,000 Finns, and their country is on the confines of Russia, their capital being but a short distance from St. Petersburg, the case would seem to be hopeless.
