THRIVING SUBURB.

Willamette Falls a Most Favored Little City—School Soon Opens

The town of Willamette Falls, three miles south of Oregon City, on the West Side, is developing into a most beautiful residence and business locality. Situated, as it is, upon a table land, where the soil is fertile, the water pure and the general conditions necessary to good health are not exceeded by any other part of our adjoining territory, and commanding a most excellent view of the Willamette river, renders the location an ideal place for intending home-builders as well as a good location to engage in business pursuits of whatever nature one might choose. The price of real estate at Willamette Falls has been placed at such a figure that locations for homes or businesses are within the reach of everybody. One of the prominent features of that locality is the cheap rate of transportation to and from. Residents there are required to pay but one dollar per month to ride to and from as many times during the month as they might choose. The water supply is abundant and of excellent quality. The mail facilities are equal to those of any metropolitan place. There is a splendid school at Willamette Falls, two instructors being employed, and the terms are usually of as great a length as are taught in the larger places. Already the business of the place supports two stores. A. S. Hunt is the accommodating postmaster, who also handles a first-class stock of general merchandise. The manufacturing concern of the Capen Shoe Company is one that is worthy of encouragement and promises to become one of the important enterprises of this section of the country. The large school building at that place has just been painted, preparatory for the opening of school on the 22nd of next month. Prof. Millard Hyatt and Miss Shupley have again been engaged for the work for the coming year. The enrollment of the school is nearly one hundred. The country tributary on the west is being rapidly opened up and put in an excellent state of cultivation. The country is particularly adapted to the culture of fruit, especially apples, and as fast as small tracts near them are put in shape, fruit trees are set out, and there are already a number of very promising young orchards. Willamette Falls has a car service equal to that supplied the suburbs of the largest cities.
