

Report of School Board.

At the school meeting held in Oregon City last week the board submitted the following report:

Oregon City, Or., Jan. 19, 1903. To the Taxpayers of School District No. 62 of Clackamas County, Oregon. Ladies and Gentlemen:—We, your Board of Directors, beg leave to submit herewith our estimate of the expenses of maintaining these schools of the district for the fiscal year ending June 30th, 1904, as also an estimate of receipts for same time.

Table with 2 columns: Item, Amount. Includes Salaries of teachers, janitors, fuel, interest on bonds, etc.

Total, \$4250 00 \$4250 00. Leaving bal. to be provided for \$5750 00.

In addition to this we will enter the year with a floating debt of \$7700 00, making a floating debt at the end of the year \$13 450, in case no special tax is levied.

We stated last year that we thought it would be necessary to employ an additional teacher for the new year, and soon after the schools opened we found that the rooms were overcrowded and that we would have to provide relief, and did so by employing another teacher and fitting up a room for a sixth grade class.

In conclusion, we recommend that a special tax levy of seven and one-half mills be made for general school purposes and the payment of interest on outstanding bonds.
