The city fathers met Wednesday night at the regular monthly meeting of council and did considerable important business for the city.

The first thing of importance which was done was the passage of the ordinance lone the construction of the sewer in District N. in District No. 3, anthorizing the com-mittee on streets and public property to advertise for bide.

In the ordinance was a clau e author-izing the appointment of a committee to assess the property to be immediately benefited by the new sewer.

An ordinance was read for the first time changing the grades of Madison, Jefferson and J. Q. Adams streets. This is deemed necessary, so that the sewer may not have to be placed as low as it otherwise would be.

Another redinance was read for the first time probabiting the explosion of large fire crackers or explosives on the streets or sidewalks of the city.

Another item of business which came up was the report of the committee on streets and public property, in which it was stated that Main street, Singer Hill, Seventh and Flith streets needed repairs. To repair these streets it was re-ported that 1500 vards of crushed rock could be necessary, and on Main street no less than 25,000 brick will be required.
