## GRIEVED TO DEATH

Mrs. Tillie Wills, of Canby, Takes Her Own Life.

Despondency, Resulting From Recent Criminal Assault, Cause Of Rash Act.

Mrs. Tillie Wills, of Canby, in a fit of despondency, suicided Saturday afternoon by taking carbolic acid. Poison was procured about 11 o'clock that morning, but body was not discovered until 3 o'clock in the afternoon at the home of her father, Colonel Barr. Coroner Holman held an inquest and the jury returned a verdict of death by carbolic acid poisoning, taken with suicidal intent.

Mrs. Wills was a widow and leaves two children. For several months she had been making her home with her father at Canby. Saturday morning she obtained a small sum of money from her father on the excuse that she expected to pick strawberries and desired to get her dinner. Her absence from home at the noon hour did not excite any suspicion, and it was not until her little son returned to the home late in the afternoon that the body was discovered cold in death within the house, which was locked. Testimony at inquest developed the fact that the poison was purchased about 11 o'clock in the morning at a local drug store. The contents of the vial, containing an ounce and a half, were taken.

The case is peculiarly a sad one. Mrs. Wills was the daughter of Col. Barr, former commissioner of Clackamas county, and was highly respected. About five weeks ago she was the victim of an outrage committed at her home by a brutal hobo. The fact that the brute was successful in his vicious assault is said to have preyed on the victim's mind and was directly responsible for the suicide.

This is the third suicide, in addition to one unsuccessful attempt at self destruction, that has taken place in this county in seven weeks.

### IS NOW BEFORE THE COURT.

Suit Involving Title to 600 Acres in Gladstone Will Soon Be Decided.

The suit to quiet title of the Gladstone Real Estate Association against T. E. Ryan, has been concluded before Judge McBride. This is an important case and involves the title to the lands better known as those upon which are located the Willamette Valley Chautauqua buildings. Judge McBride has taken the case under advisement.

There is involved in the suit 1200 lots and 160 acres of land in what is known as Gladstone Park Addition, amounting in all to about 600 acres that are valued by the Association at \$60,000. The taxes on these lands for the year 1898 were not paid and they were subsequently sold for delinquent taxes. Judge Ryan bidding the land in for \$425. The defense by the Association is that the title ought to be acquired to the lands by Ryan cannot be obtained for the reason that the assessment against the lands was void and the proceedings leading up to and including the sale of the property were irregular. Because of the great value of the lands involved, the case was one of the most vigorously fought that was ever heard in Clackamas county. H. E. Cross, G. B. Dimick and G. E. Hayes represented the Association at the trial and J. E. Hedges appeared for Judge Ryan.

### WILL BE BUILT DURING SUMMER.

Fish Ladder Will Not Be Installed at Willamette Falls for Present.

Deputy Fish Warden I. A. Webster has made an inspection of the proposed site for the fish ladder to be installed at Willamette falls at this city to enable the salmon to reach the upper Willamette. It will be impossible for the state fish commission to place the ladder until the low water season arrives late this summer, but the site is being watched as the stage of the river falls, in order to determine the best place for the ladder.

Mr. Webster says the ladder will be more of a natural means of ascent for the salmon than the usual contrivance, with great amount of superstructure. The current of the stream where the ladder is to be installed is so severe that the usual construction could not be maintained. Instead, a succession of basins will be blasted in the solid rock, about three feet apart. With a series of these natural water basins, the fish will be able to reach the upper river with ease. The last legislature made an appropriation of \$5000 for the ladder.
