Mrs. Tillie Wills, of Canby, Takes Her Own Life,

Despondency, Resulting From Recen Criminal Assault, Cause Of Rush Act.

Mrs. Tillie Wills, of Canby, in a fit of despondency, suicided Saturday afternoon by taking carbolic acid. Poison was procured about II o'clock that morning, but body was not discovered until 3 o'clock in the afternoon at the home of her father. Colonel Batr. Coroner Hel-man held an inquest and the jury re-turned a verdict of death by carbolic acid poisoning, taken with suicidal in-

Mrs. Wills was a widow and leaves two children. For several months she had been making her bome with her father at Canby. Saturday morning she obtained a small sum of money from her father on the excuse that sheex, ected to pick strawberries and desired to get her dinner. Her absence from home at the noon hour did not excite any suspicion, and it was not until her little son returned to the home late in the afternoon that the body was discovered cold in death within the house, which was ocked. Testimony at inquest developed the fact that the poison was purchased about II o'clock in the morning at a local drug store. The contents of the vial, containing an ounce and a baif, were

The case is peculiarly a sad one. Mrs. Wills was the daughter of Coi. Bair, former commissioner of Clackamas county, and was highly respected. About five weeks ago she was the victim of an outrage committed at her home by a brutal liobo. The fact that the brute was successful in his vicious assault is said to have preyed on the victim's mind and was directly responsible for the suicide.
This is the third suicide, in audition to

one unsuccessful attempt at self-destruction, that has taken place in this county in seven weeks.


