In the matter of claim of Cumins & Co. of \$312.50 for lumber. Ordered that same be laid over until completion of contract.

In the matter of the petition of Fred Brakebush for a private gateway. Ordered that clerk of this court be instructed to notify said petitioner to pay expenses.

In the matter of application of Meade Post G. A. R., for relief of Robert Leslie, indigent soldier. Ordered that said post be granted \$5 per month until further orders.

In the matter of report of architect regarding amount due contractors for court house improvement. Ordered that warrant for \$500 be issued to said contractors.

In the matter of bridge on Clackamas road near Ericksons. Ordered that Supervisor of the road district repair the same.
