

CAN YOU GUESS?

Then Take a Chance in the Prize Money Contest.

On Washington's Birthday the Enterprise Will Give Away Another Jar of Money.

Are you a good guesser? If so, and you can tell how much money a jar contains, you should not fail to participate in the prize money guessing contest that the Enterprise has provided for its present and prospective readers.

The Enterprise has decided to make some substantial presents to some of its subscribers. We have filled a class jar with coins and currency of different denominations. The amount of money that is contained in the jar is not known to any one. We placed the bulk of the money in the jar and the balance, in unknown denominations and also amount, was deposited in the jar by a person not connected with the office, the amount so placed by each being entirely unknown to the other.

The seal on the jar will be broken on the afternoon of February 22, next, and the award of the money will be made as follows:

- 50 per cent to the person guessing closest to the amount in the jar;
25 per cent to the person guessing second closest to the amount, and
5 per cent each to the next five persons guessing next closest as to the total amount in the jar.

In arranging the details it has been the endeavor of the Enterprise to make the contest absolutely fair and with the aid of a disinterested party we think we have succeeded to the end that the best guesser is the man who will get the bulk of the amount contained in the jar.
