"Very well; you know what I am, but I am sure you do not know what you are, and if you wish I will tell you. You are a fool!"

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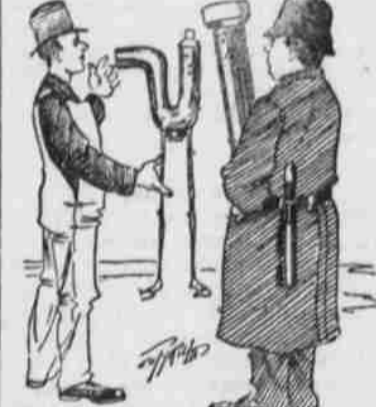
