Republican State Convention.

Notice is hereby given that the Republican state convention of the Republican party of the state of Oregon is hereby called to meet in the city of Portland, Oregon, on Thursday, April 14, 1904, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. of said day, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the various state offices to be voted for at the regular state election to be held in the state of Oregon on Monday, the 6th day of June, 1904, namely:

- One supreme judge, for a period of six years.
One dairy and food commissioner, for a period of four years.
Four presidential electors (to be voted for in November, 1904).
Circuit judges and district attorneys for judicial districts of the state, for the term of six years and four years respectively.
Joint representatives and senators for the various districts.
There will also be chosen at said convention four delegates to the National Republican Convention.

The various counties of the state of Oregon shall be entitled to representation in said convention as follows: One delegate at large for each county, and one delegate for every 150 votes, and one additional delegate for each fraction thereof over 100 votes, cast for R. S. Bean for supreme judge at the state election of 1902, the number for the respective counties being as follows:

World's Fair News-Notes. There are 147,250 panes of glass, 18 by 25 inches, in the Palace of Agriculture at the World's Fair.

Seven thousand lineal feet or nearly a mile and a half of platforms four feet high are being built for the unloading of exhibits at the World's Fair.

Twelve thousand carloads of exhibits are expected by the director of exhibits of the World's Fair. At the Columbian Exposition at Chicago 8,000 carloads were received.

Two hundred of Uncle Sam's marines who have been on duty at Panama are going to the World's Fair to give exhibition drills. The popularity of this branch of the service is increasing with young men who want to be cosmopolitans.

Night has been turned into day in all of the large exhibit palaces at the World's Fair. Numerous electric arc lights have been put in place and scores of workmen are busy night as well as day in installing the exhibits.

A pack train of 24 horses, with all of their accoutrements, will be one of the novelties at the World's Fair. The unusual spectacle will be sent by citizens of Wyoming to mark Wyoming day. The horses will all be equipped as if ready to start on the trail.

A San Diego, Cal., woman will exhibit at the World's Fair, butter made in 1858. The butter was placed in a spring house in that year and it disappeared in the quick sand. It was recently recovered and was found to be in a remarkably good state of preservation. It is now in cold storage.

The Belgian building at the World's Fair, one of the largest and handsomest in the foreign section, is remarkable in that the walls are not broken by a single window. The large structure is well lighted by immense sky lights, 75 feet above the floor.

Progress in medicine and surgery will be shown by an excellent exhibit of appliances, instruments and apparatus for surgery and medical research in the Palace of Liberal Arts at the World's Fair. A complete modern hospital, with all of the accessories and apparatus known to the most advanced surgery will be the most prominent feature of this group.

Call for Congressional Convention.

A convention of the Republican party of the first congressional district of the state of Oregon is hereby called to meet in Salem, Ore., Wednesday, April 13, at 11 a. m., for the purpose of nominating one representative for congress and to transact such other business as may properly come before the convention.

The convention will consist of 177 delegates, apportioned among the several counties of the district as follows, to-wit: Benton, 7; Clackamas, 18; Coos, 9; Curry, 3; Douglas, 14; Jackson, 12; Josephine, 7; Klamath, 4; Lake, 4; Lane, 19; Lincoln, 5; Linn, 14; Marion, 23; Polk, 9; Tillamook, 5; Washington, 13; Yamhill, 11; total, 177.

The same being, one delegate-at-large for each county, one for every 150 votes cast for Judge Bean on the last general election, and one for every fraction of 150 larger than 100.
