FOR THE COUNTY CONVENTION

Republicans Will Name Candidates, Saturday, April 6.

The Republican Convention for Clackamas county, Oregon, is hereby called to meet in the Willamette hall, Oregon City, Saturday the 6th day of April, 1904 at the hour of ten o'clock, a. m., for the purpose of electing eighteen delegates to the State Republican convention to be held at Portland, Oregon, on the 11th day of April, 1904, and eighteen delegates to the Republican Congressional convention of the first Congressional District, to be held at Salem, Ore., on April 11, 1904; also for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following offices, to-wit: Three representatives to the State Legislature, county commissioner, sheriff, clerk, recorder, assessor, treasurer, school superintendent, surveyor, coroner and justices of the peace and constable for the several precincts.

- The convention will consist of 143 delegates, apportioned to the several precincts as follows, said apportionment being based on one delegate at large for each precinct and one for every 24 votes cast for S. R. Bean for supreme judge at the election of 1902 and one for major fraction thereof: Abernethy 7, Barlow 3, Beaver Creek 5, Borings 3, Bull Run 3, Canby 5, Canemah 4, Canyon Creek 2, Clackamas 5, Case des 4, Cherryville 2, Damascus 4, Eagle Creek 4, Garfield 2, George 2, Harding 3, Highland 4, Killin 3, Mackburg 2, Maple Lane 3, Milk Creek 3, Milwaukie 6, Marquam 3, Molalla 4, Needy 4, New Era 3, Oregon City No 1 3, Oregon City No 2 3, Oregon City No 3 3, Oswego 5, Pleasant Hill 4, Soda Springs 2, Springwater 2, Tualatin 3, Union 2, Viola 2, West Oregon City 6.

Each precinct shall be represented by duly elected delegates in person, or by residents of the same precinct holding proxies of said delegates.

In all precincts where delegates are elected at a primary meeting, the central committee for said precinct will preside and the meeting will elect a secretary. Should the precinct committee fail to be present at the hour appointed, the electors, after waiting one hour, shall elect a chairman for the meeting.

For Oregon City, No. 1 Precinct, the following judges are appointed: H. W. Trembath, chairman; Jno. Bittner and W. H. Howell.

For Oregon City No. 2 Precinct, the following judges are appointed: C. C. Babcock, chairman, Eli Maddock and Lily Stipp.

For Oregon City No. 3 Precinct, the following judges are appointed: Henry Gilbert, chairman, Joe Harrington and J. R. Williams.

Republican State Convention.

It is also recommended that the primaries in the various counties be held on Saturday, the 2d day of April, 1904, and the various county conventions on Thursday, April 7, 1904. STUPIDITY OF SHEEP.

The Way These Exasperating Foolish Animals Court Death.

A sheep herder gives some of his experience in handling sheep on the western ranges in the following: We have to watch them every minute, and if vigilance is relaxed for an instant the entire flock is likely to commit suicide. In handling most animals some degree of self help or intelligence can be relied on to aid the owner in saving their lives, but sheep seem to set deliberately to work to kill themselves.

If caught in a storm on the plains, they will drift before the wind and die of cold and exposure rather than move 100 yards to windward to obtain shelter in their corral. To drive sheep against the wind is absolutely impossible. I once lost over 1,000 head because I could not drive them to a corral 200 feet away.

In the corral they are still more foolish. If a storm comes up, they all move "down wind" until stopped by the fence. Then commences the proceeding so much dreaded by sheepmen, known as "piling." The sheep will climb over one another's backs until they are heaped up ten feet high. Of course all those on the bottom are smothered. Not one has sense enough to seek shelter under the lee of the fence, as a horse or dog would do.

Again, if a sheep gets into quicksand its fate teaches nothing to those that come immediately after, but the whole flock will follow the leader to destruction. No more exasperatingly stupid animal than a sheep walks.

Bearded Women. Bearded women have existed at all periods of the world's history. Ever Herodotus, the "father of history," gives us an account of one Pedasnes, "who lived above Halicarnassus," a priestess of Minerva, whose chin regularly budded with a large beard whenever any great public calamity impended.
