PROPOSALS FOR IMPROVEMENT BONDS, OREGON CITY, OREGON.

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned at the office of the Recorder of Oregon City, Oregon, until Monday, November 14, 1904, at 4 o'clock p. m., for the sale at not less than par value and accrued interest, of improvement bonds of Oregon City, Oregon, as the same shall be authorized to be issued for the sum of Seven Hundred and Ninety and 73.100 Dollars.

Said bonds shall be issued in the following denominations: one bond for \$500.00 and one bond for \$250.00, each to be dated when authorized, payable ten years from date, bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, interest and principal payable in United States Gold Coin, at the office of the Treasurer of Oregon City, Oregon, provided, however, that Oregon City reserves the right to take up and cancel such bonds upon the payment of the face value thereof, with accrued interest to the date of payment, at any semi-annual coupon period at or after one year from the date of such bonds.

Said bonds are issued under authority of an Act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, passed February 16, 1893, entitled, "An Act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and the laying of sewers in incorporated cities, and for the payment of cost of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments," as amended by an Act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, approved February 28, 1901, entitled, "An Act to amend Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, of an Act entitled, 'An Act to provide for the issuance of bonds for the improvement of streets and laying of sewers in incorporated cities, and for the payment of the cost of such improvements and laying of sewers by installments, filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 22, 1893,' and the proceeds thereof are to be used for the payment in part for the improvement of streets as the said improvement shall be duly authorized and completed."

The validity of the Act of the Legislature aforesaid, has been affirmed by the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon.

Said bonds will be issued and delivered as the Council shall direct.

Bidders will be required to submit a flat bid, without conditions, except as to the regularity of each issue of bonds, and to submit with their bids a certified check equal to five per cent of the aggregate amount of the bid, payable to the Mayor of Oregon City, as liquidated damages in case such bidder withdraws his bid or fails or neglects to enter into contract to take and pay for said bonds according to the terms of his bid and this notice. The right to reject any and all bids is hereby reserved.
