

BURNED FACTORY

OREGON CITY VISITED BY \$7200 FIRE LAST FRIDAY.

New Furniture Factory of Frank Busch's Practically Wiped Out—Also Old Brewery.

Last Friday night the old Oregon City Brewery building was burned to the ground and the furniture factory, recently established by Frank Busch, was practically reduced to ashes.

The fire started in a part of the brewery building that was occupied by a Chinese janitor, and resulted from faulty chimney connections.

The old brewery building was a landmark in Oregon City, having been built in 1856. For a number of years it has been used for a stable and store house for the Weinhard brewery.
