### COUNTY COURT—Continued.

West Oregon City; J. Humphreys, West Oregon City; E. Blomberg, West Oregon City; R. J. Goodfellow, West Oregon City; C. A. Miller, West Oregon City; Jacob Josi, West Oregon City.

In the matter of road district boundaries:

Ordered that road district boundary lines be the same as of the January term, 1904 except as follows: Boundary lines between Viola and Springwater road districts changed as follows:

Begin at section corner between sections 29, 30, 31, and 32, T. 3 S., R. 4 E., running thence north one mile; thence West 1 1/2 miles; thence north 1/4 mile; thence west 1/2 mile; thence North 1/4 miles; thence West 1/2 mile to center of section 14, T. 3 S., R. 4 E.; thence North one mile to boundary line between Viola and Harding road districts.

That the boundary line between Canyon Creek and Molalla road districts be changed as follows:

Begin the Northwest corner of Section 1, T. 5 S., R. 2 E., running thence south 1 1/2 miles; thence East 1/2 mile to the center of Section 12, T. 5 S., R. 2 E.; thence south 1 mile to center of Section 13; thence East 3/4 miles; thence south 1 mile; thence east 3 miles; thence south 2 1/2 miles to Southeast corner of section 36, T. 5 South, Range 3 east.

That the boundary lines of West Oregon City No. 34, be changed to take in a part of Oswego road district No. 30, as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of section 22, Township 2 South, range 1 East; thence West two miles; thence south 3 miles to SW corner of section 33, in said township; thence East to the Tualitan river; thence down the Tualitan river to the Willamette river; thence down the Willamette river to the northeast corner of the G. Walling claim No. 63; thence along the north line of the Walling claim to section line between sections 14 and 15; thence south on section line to place of beginning.

That Tualitan road district No. 31 be created as follows:

Commencing on Tualitan river between Washington and Clackamas Counties; running thence south and west on division line of said counties to the Northwest corner of section 12, T. 3 S., R. 1 W., thence south to the Willamette river; thence down the Willamette river to the mouth of the Tualitan river; thence up the Tualitan river to where the South line of section 34, T. 2 South, R. 1 East, crosses said river; thence west along south line of Sections 34 and 33 to southwest corner of section 33; thence north to Tualitan river; thence up Tualitan river to place of beginning.

That the boundary lines of New Era district No. 16 be changed by taking all of said road district No. 16 lying west of the Willamette river and attaching same to road district No. 31.

In the matter of clerk hire in the County Clerks office;

Ordered that said clerk be permitted to employ additional clerks to extend and complete the tax rolls.

In the matter of the appointment of deputy assessor;

Ordered that the appointment of F. J. Nelson as deputy assessor be approved, he to receive \$60 per month for such services and to serve until further orders of this court.

In the matter of the application of John McNamara:

Ordered that warrant issue to Mrs. Bradt for \$12.00 for care of said McNamara until further orders.

In the matter of the petition of Henry McGugin and others for aid to Mrs. Mattie Pickens and family:

Ordered that petition be granted and that she be allowed \$10 per month until further orders.

In the matter of the petition for franchise by the West Oregon City Telephone Co.:

Ordered that said petition be granted subject to orders of this court.

In the matter of the bond of Assessor:

Ordered that the bond of J. F. Nelson as Assessor be approved.

In the matter of special tax levies in road districts Nos. 21 and 22:

Ordered that same be approved.

In the matter of the petition of S. A. D. Hungate and others for bridge across slough at Dickey Prairie bridge:

Ordered that same be taken under advisement until site can be inspected.

In the matter of the Arndt road:

Ordered that this matter be referred to District Attorney for opinion.

In the matter of estimates of amounts of money to be raised in Clackamas county upon tax roll of 1904:

Pauper expense, \$3000; Expenses Circuit Court, \$3400; Justice of the Peace Courts, \$1500; Expenses County Jail, \$500; Repairs to Court House, \$450; Care of Indigent Soldiers, \$450; County Physician and Board Health, \$400; Sheriff's office, \$3500; Clerk's office, \$2900; Recorder's office, \$2600; Assessor's office \$4000; Treasurer's office, \$1300; School Superintendent's office, \$1400; County Court and Commissioners, \$1700; Surveyor's office and Road Viewers, \$1000; Coroner's office, \$650; Collection of taxes, \$2500; Printing and advertising, \$750; Books and stationery, \$800; Insane commitments and expense, \$350 making a total of \$33,250.00.

To which should be added: Construction and repairs of bridges, \$19,000; interest on outstanding warrants, \$8100; State School Tax, \$47,826; General State Levy, \$34,337.00; Roads and Highways, \$27,000; Reduction of County Debt, \$2900, making a total of \$189,513.00.

In the matter of plank for roads:

Ordered that all plank furnished for county roads shall be at least ten inches in width, and supervisors are notified to refuse to receive or allow any plank of less width to be laid on county roads when said plank are to be paid for by county.

In the matter of the report of Miss Chase on condition of Treasurer's account with the school districts on account of special school taxes;

Ordered that said report be continued until February term of this court.

In the matter of the tax levy for 1905;

Ordered that there be and there is hereby levied upon each and every dollar of the taxable property, real personal, and mixed, situated in the county of Clackamas on the first day of

March 1904, a tax of Twenty and one-half mills: 250-1000 for school; 215-1000 for state tax; 125-1000 for road tax; 115-1000 for bridge; 50-1000 for interest; 145-000 for general county; and 100-1000 for county indebtedness, and same is hereby ordered extended on tax roll and collected in manner required by law.
