In the matter of aid to Henry Waters; Ordered that warrant for said aid be drawn in favor of F. W. Sprague.

In the matter of tolls on Mt. Hood & Harlow road for year 1905; Ordered that tolls be as follows:

In the matter of the petition of Wm. Smith and others for county road;

Ordered that Viewers meet at place of beginning of said road on the 24th day of April, 1905.

In the matter of the petition of L. Robertson and others for a county road;

Ordered that the Viewers meet at place of beginning on the 19th day of April, 1905.

In the matter of the petition of N. Nelson and others for county road;

Ordered that Viewers meet at place of beginning of said road on the 17th of April, 1905.

In the matter of the grading and improving Bohlander Hill;

Ordered that said improvement be taken under advisement to ascertain cost.

In the matter of the improvement of Boring & Kelso road on township line;

Ordered that court visit and inspect said road before final action is taken.

In the matter of the petition of Milton W. Smith for cancellation of certain taxes;

Ordered that this matter be laid over to allow petitioner to file receipts for taxes claimed to have been paid.

In the matter of ditching Grange Hall and Canby road;

Ordered that supervisor use the labor and money subscribed and \$25.00 in ditching said road.

In the matter of the petition to vacate certain blocks, streets and alleys in township of Eagle Creek;

Ordered that said matter be taken under advisement, pending a visit to same by court.

In the matter of the Barton and Logan road;

In the matter of application of the Citizen's Bank of East Portland for settlement of taxes;

Ordered that the clerk accept the sum of \$72.50 in satisfaction of mortgage taxes for years 1890, 1891 and 1892.

In the matter of application of Portland General Electric Company for right to use portions of roads for transmission of light and power;

Ordered that said application be granted subject to regulation of County Court.

In the matter of claim of Mrs. Bowerman for the care of David Mortimore, a county charge;

Ordered that she be allowed the sum of \$8.00.

In the matter of petition and subscription of Crittenden & Saddle for improvement of road from Mackstown to Aurora;

Ordered that same be taken under advisement for inspection and explanation of subscription payments.

In the matter of petition of Wm. Smart to remove obstructions from county road to enable him to make needed improvement of same;

Ordered that road supervisor of road district No. 2, open said county road to full width by having parties remove any fences or obstructions placed by them upon same.

In the matter of the appointment of A. H. Dowling as deputy sheriff,

Ordered that same be approved, he to serve without pay.

In the matter of improvement of road from Clackamas bridge at Parkplace to Clackamas;

Ordered that County Judge have plans prepared for such improvement, so that cost may be determined.

In the matter of bond of F. W. Greenman as County Clerk;

Ordered that same be and is approved.

In the matter of saloon license of Annie Corrigan at Estacada;

Ordered that a license issue to her for the remainder of the twelve months of this year.

In the matter of plans and specifications for bridge across Clackamas on Barton and Logan Road;

Ordered that D. W. Kinnard prepare plans and specifications and submit same to this court.

In the matter of the purchase of two Road King Graders;

Ordered that two of said road graders be purchased, the same to be delivered and operated to satisfaction of court before payment.

In the matter of collection of delinquent taxes for several years;
