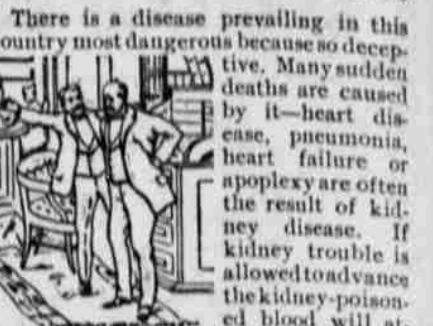
"Schnee im Monat Mai"
