RULES GOVERNING SALE.

How Government Proposes to Sell Grand Ronde Tracts.

The remaining unsold acreage of the Grand Ronde Indian Reservation will be sold by the Government in October, bids for the purchase of the same having been advertised for. At a sale last August a total of 16,318,48 acres were sold. leaving still unsold 9,703.06 acres of the original tract which contained 25,791 acres. By the terms of the sale, bids fer individual tracts as per schedule that may be had upon application at the Portland Land Office, sealed blds will be received between 9 a. m. October 3 and Il a. m. October 10.

The said sealed bids must be prepared. filed, received, opened, and acted on in accordance with the following rules and regulations:

First. Each bid must be made upon a form similar to that attached hereto. which will be furnished upon application to the register and receiver of the Portland ,Oregon land Office, or the Commissioner of the General Land Office, and must be signed by the bidder, who shall he a citizen of the United States, and who shall therein give his post office address

Second. Each bid must be sealed in separate envelope, which shall be addressed to the "Register and Receiver. United States Land Office, Portland, Oregon." and such said envelope must bear an endorsement across the face showing that it contains a bid for the ceded lands of the Grande Ronde Indian Reservation. and must not bear any indication of the amount of such hid or the description of the tract bid for.

Third. Each bid must be accompanied by a check, payable to the Secretary of the Interior, certified by the proper official of a national bank, for 20 per cent of the amount of such bid, which check must be, by the bidder, placed in the envelope containing the bid before its sealing and delivery to the register and recelver.


